

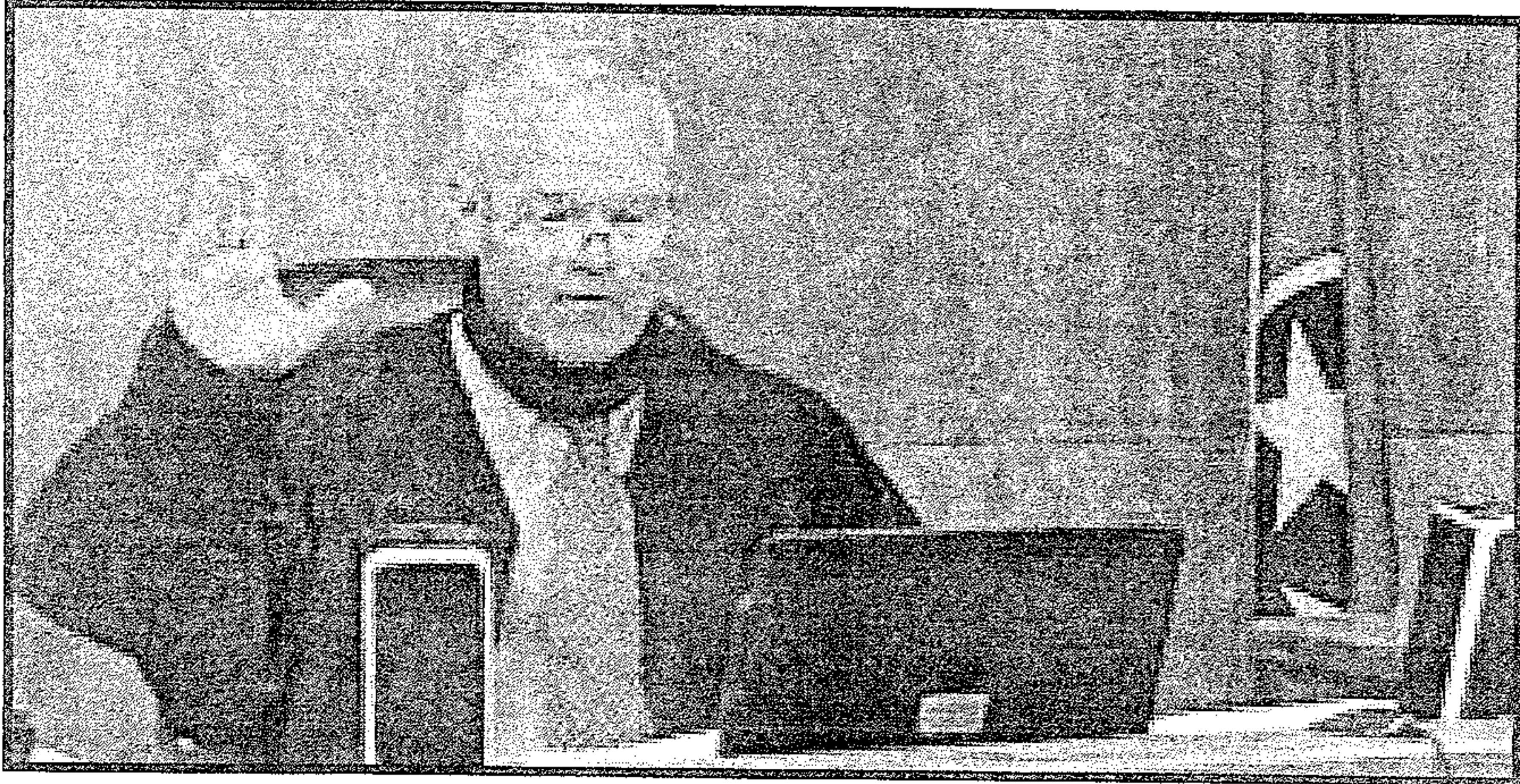

## U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey Announces \$1,391,296 Million Award To Address School Violence Prevention In East Tennessee

United States Attorney J. Douglas Overbey of the Eastern District of Tennessee announced today, the City of Knoxville, Bradley County School District, and Monroe County Schools received \$1,391,296 from the Department of Justice's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) School Violence Prevention

Program (SVPP). Nationally, the COPS Office SVPP awarded nearly \$50 million in school safety funding. SVPP provides up to 75% funding for school safety measures in and around primary and secondary schools and school grounds.

"As schools reopen for in-person and on-line, it is imperative we adjust to meet the unique needs and circumstances of our

communities. These funds will provide essential resources to help mitigate the impact of on-line learning and provide necessary protection in keeping all students safe. Additionally, these grant funds will help provide vital services to ensure a safe and productive school year for everyone," said U.S. Attorney

**Guilty**

Courtney Bingham (age 36 now) pleaded guilty in Loudon County Criminal Court today to five felony charges related her sexual relationship with a 16 year old boy in November and December 2018 soon after she had turned 35 years old. An investigation was conducted by Jason Smith who was a detective with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office. Bingham was set to go to trial next week on September 15th, but entered the guilty plea today in lieu of a trial by jury. She pleaded guilty to four felony counts of Aggravated Statutory Rape and received a sentence of four years to serve on each conviction. Three of the four year sentences will run consecutive to each other for an effective sentence to serve of 12 years. Bingham also

pleaded guilty to one felony count of Solicitation of a Minor to Commit Statutory Rape by Authority Figure and received a four year sentence on that charge as well which is to run concurrently with the 12 year sentence on the other four felony convictions. Essentially, Bingham ended up with a 12 year sentence to serve in TDOC custody at a minimum of 35% before she is eligible for the possibility of parole. She will be on the Sex Offender Registry for Life and subject to monitoring, including monitoring of her internet activities.

As part of her plea, Bingham pleaded guilty to one felony count of Solicitation of a Minor to Commit Statutory Rape by Authority Figure and received a four year sentence on that charge as well which is to run concurrently with the 12 year sentence on the other four felony convictions. Essentially, Bingham ended up with a 12 year sentence to serve in TDOC custody at a minimum of 35% before she is eligible for the possibility of parole. She will be on the Sex Offender Registry for Life and subject to monitoring, including monitoring of her internet activities.

Carley Cusick, 22, Browder Hollow Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault, Vandalism, and Violation of Probation.

Officer J. Dishner LCPD, was dispatched to a domestic disturbance at Browder Hollow Road. Dispatch advised that Carley Cusick was on scene threatening the victim with a bat and broom handle, and advised Cusick had broken a window out. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Carley in the driveway. Carley advised Officer she had come to the residence to take a shower. Carley stated that an argument started after Carley medicine was missing. Sgt. Rayfield spoke with the victim who stated Carley became irate accusing her of stealing her medicine. The victim was able to get Carley outside and locked

her out of the residence. At that point Carley retrieved a 18 inch wooden bat from the vehicle and began hitting the residence, and made threats against the victim. Carley did break a window out of the residence. Carley Cusick was the primary aggressor and placed under arrest.

ham admitted to having sex with the minor on at least four separate occasions, knowing that he was minor and that she was more than ten years older than him, thus creating the aggravating factor. Additionally, as part of her stipulation to the facts on the solicitation charge, she admitted that she was in a position of trust (she was in a supervisory capacity

of the victim when he was a member of the youth group at their church) when she 'solicited' him for sex via digital communication.

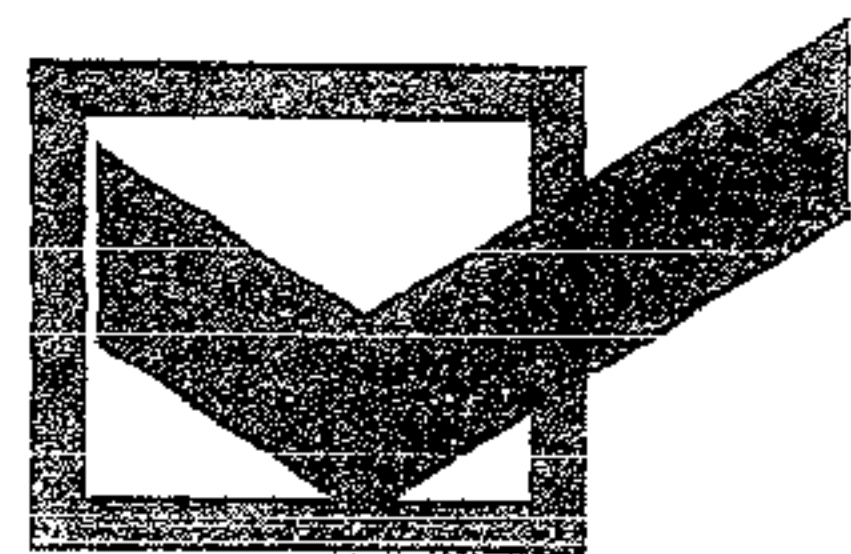





**Meth**

Ashli Cancelmo, 33, Greenwood Road Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Dell/Resale of Meth, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer Jamie Ketner LCPD, observed a vehicle traveling on Broadway, with its left head light not working.

Officer stopped the vehicle, and the registration did not come back to said vehicle. While speaking with the driver Ashli Cancelmo, appeared to be very nervous. Cpl. Hutchins LCSO arrived on scene and deployed K-9 Dante, while Officer was writing Cancelmo a citation. Dante alerted to the odor of narcotics. A set of digital scales and baggie with crystal residue was located inside the vehicle. Cancelmo stated to Officer she had a 20 bag of

meth on her person.

Ashli Cancelmo was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Once at the jail Deputy Harrill located 1 ½ blue pills identified as Oxycodone during a search of Cancelmo, and also located 13 .14 grams of meth that was separated into three different baggies and 60.00 dollars was in her underwear. Cancelmo stated to Deputy Harril that she was going to sell the meth to pay bills.

dy was in charge of this case for District Attorney General Russell Johnson's Office. General Johnson stated that "this case has generated tremendous community interest because of the nature of the charges and the fact that it has caused considerable 'disruption' at the suspect's and victim's church. " Johnson went

on to say, "We are glad to get this resolved with the defendant admitting her wrongdoing. Hopefully, this outcome will serve as a cautionary tale for others who are tempted to find themselves in similar situations. Part of the reason for pressing this case to trial, which resulted in what I consider to be a significant result for the State, was the difference in ages between the defendant and victim, the defendant's position of trust in the church, and her prior multiple felony criminal his-






Bingham is turning herself in to the Loudon County Jail on October 11th to go into custody to begin serving her TDOC sentence.



“With the new school year underway, the safety of our nation’s students remains paramount,” said COPS Office Director Phil Keith. “Although this school year may look different at the start, now is the ideal time to make preparations to enhance school safety for when all of our children are back in the classroom.”

The Students, Teachers, and Officers Preventing School Violence Act of 2018 (STOP School Violence Act of 2018) gave the COPS Office authority to provide awards directly to states, units of local government, Indian tribes, and public agencies (such as school districts and law enforcement agencies) to improve security at schools and on school grounds in the jurisdiction of the grantee through evidence-based school safety programs. The three awards announced today can be used for coordination with law enforcement; training for local law enforcement officers

to prevent student violence; metal detectors, locks, lighting, and other deterrent measures; technology for expedited notification of local law enforcement during an emergency; and other measures that provide a significant improvement in security. In addition to the school safety grants announced today, the COPS Office School Safety Working Group, which is composed of representatives from eight national law enforcement organizations, has identified 10 essential actions that can be taken by schools, school districts, and law enforcement agencies to help prevent critical incidents involving the loss of life or injuries in our nation’s schools and to respond rapidly and effectively when incidents do occur. The Ten Essential Actions to Improve School Safety are applicable to school shootings as well as to other areas of school safe-

ty, including natural disasters and traumatic events such as student suicide. Adopting policies and practices based on the recommendations in this publication can help make school communities safer and save lives.

The COPS Office is the federal component of the Department of Justice responsible for advancing community policing nationwide. Since

1994, the COPS Office has invested more than \$14 billion to advance community policing, including grants awarded to more than 13,000 state, local and tribal law enforcement agencies to fund the hiring and redeployment of more than 134,000 officers and provide a variety of knowledge resource products including publications, training and technical assistance.


