



CDC Extends Order at the Southern and Northern Land Borders

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has issued an order under Sections 362 and 365 of the Public Health Service Act, and associated implementing regulations, that temporarily suspends the introduction of certain noncitizens based on the Director's deter-

mination that introduction of such noncitizens, regardless of their country of origin, migrating through Canada and Mexico into the United States creates a serious danger of the introduction of COVID-19 into the United States, and the danger is so increased by the introduction of such noncitizens that a

temporary suspension is necessary to protect the public health. Unaccompanied noncitizen children, already excepted under a July 16, 2021 order, remain excepted from the order's coverage.

CDC is continuing to assess the impact

John Stone, 24, Church Street Philadelphia, was charged with DUI, Financial Responsibility, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Deputy Bengel LCSO, responded to Taylor Drive in reference to a Vandalism call. The Complainant, stated that the Offender, John Stone, had hit her neighbor's mailbox and was attempting to flee the scene. Deputy arrived on the scene within a minute of being dispatched and observed Stone in the middle of Taylor Dr. in a Mercury. Stone was in front of Taylor Dr. and was backing up. Witness knows Stone and attempted to feed him and take care of him to get him to sober up. Stone decided to leave the residence and Witness attempted to stop him to no avail. Witness witnessed Stone run over the neighbor's mailbox, make a U-turn in his yard and him attempting to flee the scene. Stone stopped the car and Witness walked up to the car and removed the key from the ignition. Witness stated the car was a manual and that Stone was able to push the car and jumpstart it. Deputy spoke to the neighbor whose mailbox was run over and he witnessed the vandalism as well. The neighbor refused a report and said that he had already made a verbal agreement with witness to fix the mailbox. Deputy was unable to confirm if Mercury had valid insurance. Dispatch advised that Stone did not have a valid driver's license and was ID only. Stone was transported to the Loudon County Jail. While en route to the jail, Stone made a spontaneous utterance and stated that he knew a loophole and would be released when he went to court.

Stone elaborated and stated that since he did not give a blood sample that Deputy couldn't prove what was in his system. Stone is being charged with DUI, Implied Consent, Driving without a Valid Drivers License and Financial responsibility.
