SWC Sends Cease and Desist Letter to Illegal Sportsbook BetOnline

Bettors Are Encouraged to Withdraw Funds Immediately

The Sports Wagering Council (SWC) issued a cease and desist letter to illegal offshore sportsbook Bet-Online demanding it shut down operations in Tennessee.

BetOnline is operating within the borders of Tennessee in violation of the Tennessee Sports Gaming Act unlawfully accepting wagers without a license, and the sports-

Steven Patton, 22, Deer Cove Drive Greenback, was charged with Aggravated As-

Deputy Billy Lewis responded to Deer Cove Drive for a Physical Domestic. Upon arrival and Sgt. Smith arrival, Lewis made contact and detained for officer safety Steven Patton, who was outside spraying his face with a water hose. Steven said that he and his sister got into a fight, which resulted in him striking her in the face with Great Value Bleach. The deputy then spoke with the victim, who was standing in the kitchen being attended to by Chief Lett. The victim said that Steven showed up to the home gathering up some items, stating some did not belong to him. The victim called her parents, and Steven was asked to leave by his father. Steven agreed to leave and asked his sister to step back so he could shut the door. Steven pulled the door partially shut and stood there staring at her. When she attempted to shut the door, Steven "Busted" opened the door and struck her with a container of bleach, busting it in her eye's mouth, face, and clothing. The victim said that she had the bleach in her mouth which caused her temporary blindness to the point she could not see anything, possibly swallowed some. The victim was transported to Fort Loudon Emergency Room for treatment. The deputy took Steven Patton into custody for Aggravated Domestic Assault and transported him to Fort Loudon Emergency Room for treatment prior to transporting to the jail without incident. tUS, MyBookie, and Xbet, and in November 2024 the illegal offshore book Bovada shut down in Tennessee after the SWC issued it \$50,000 in fines. In April, the SWC issued cease and desist letters to illegal offshore sportsbooks Sportsbetting.ag and Lowvig.

Additionally, any businesses in Tennessee working in conjunction with illegal offshore sportsbooks could face criminal penalties. Those interested can always go to tn gov/swac for a list of licensees and vendors approved to do business in Tennessee.

"Shuttering illegal sportsbooks will benefit the legal-

ized market, our licensed operators and the public good in Tennessee, but illegal offshore sportsbooks are not going to go away easily," SWC Ex-ecutive Director Mary Beth Thomas said. "We envision a Tennessee where all sports wager are legal, and we're working closely with our network of law enforcement at the state and federal levels to make that vision a reality."

Tennessee is the largest "online-only" sports betting market in the U.S. with more than \$4.8 billion wagered to date this fiscal year through online sportsbooks licensed

by the SWC.





To the Citizens of Lenoir City:


